Scholarship Purpose

This scholarship fund has been established by the Caroline County Council of Arts (CCCA) in honor of Mark Grande, who was the CCCA Executive Director before his death in 2005. Mark was an extremely talented man who gave freely of his time in a number of areas. In addition to his duties with the CCCA, he was a musician and photographer. The fund will help graduating Caroline County students who are pursuing studies in the performing & visual arts.

Award Amount

This year the CCCA will award two (2) \$500 scholarships to graduating seniors who plan to attend college in the fall of 2010.

Eligibility

- Graduating Caroline County High School Senior.
- Grade Point Average: 3.0 or higher.
- Planning to study performing or visual arts at a college or university by the fall of 2010.

Application Packet

- Complete and sign the Mark Grande Arts Scholarship Application Form.
- Include an official copy of your most recent High School transcript.
- Include at least three (3) Letters of Recommendation:
 - Two (2) from current or recent teachers.
 - One (1) personal reference.
- Include a typed 300 – 500 word essay describing why you are interested in pursuing further study in performing or visual arts.
- Include an Artwork Portfolio or Performance CD/DVD of no more than ten (10) works of art with a reference sheet that includes a brief description (title, medium, date occurred, objective, etc.) of each work.

Application Submission

- Scholarship recipients will be notified by the end of May 2010
- Award certificates will be presented at your high school's Awards Ceremony.
- Award payments will be made in the scholarship recipient's name and paid directly to the college/university to which they are enrolled upon receipt of a copy of the acceptance letter from that school.
